Registration is Now Open! Tustin Pickleball Ladder Event Sunday, September 24, 2023

Registration is now open for our fall season Tustin Pickleball Ladder event, which will be held at our courts on Sunday September 24th. Men and women participants will play together in fun, competitive matches where they have an opportunity to move up or down courts as they win or lose games. For this event, there will be four divisions:

- Advanced (4.0+) 7:30-10:30am
- Novice (2.5-3.0) 7:30-10:30am
- Intermediate (3.0-3.5) 11am-2pm
- Adv Intermediate (3.5+) 11am-2pm
- Starting position (court number and side) will be drawn by each player at check-in.
- Each match is played to 11 points win by 2, or until 12 minutes (whichever comes first).
- At the end of each match, the winning team will move up a court and the losing team will move down a court.
- The goal is to win games and advance to a higher court, with court 1* being the highest position on the ladder (*our courts will be temporarily renumbered for this event).
- When you move up or down a court, you split with your partner and pair with a new partner from the other team who has also moved to your court.
- ✤ All participants will play in 8 games total, with up to 2-1/2 hours of overall play.
- ◆ Prizes will be awarded to the top 3 teams in each division.

Facilities Update

- Webster the Webcam continues to be a valued asset for our members. During the long rainy season this year, there were many days when Webster exceeded 500 views!
- TUSD maintenance will continue to clean the courts approximately once a month. (Yes, we have provided feedback that their cleaning process must be improved!)
- We replaced the worn-out nets on courts 3, 8 and 10, and replaced the sun shade fabric on court 10.
- The club's storage shed will be moved from court 7 to court 4 as part of TUSD's new parking lot construction project. This is an ongoing project, delayed due to changing priorities for TUSD maintenance. The project is scheduled for completion by end of the year.
- Over the past several weeks, we have been working with the TUSD maintenance department on a proposed project to add two additional courts to the south side of the facility where courts 7, 8, 9 and 10 currently exist.
 - The project includes removing existing structures and fencing, building new fencing and gates between the new courts, removing and adding net posts, court resurfacing and painting of lines, squaring off the two fence corners on the south end, and fixing the expansion joint (crack) that runs through courts 2 and 5.
 - We received multiple bids for the project and are currently going through the process of obtaining approval to proceed from the District.
 - We are also seeking approval on our proposal for cost sharing which will be reviewed by the TUSD Board of Education next week.
 - If all goes as planned, we should be able to make a decision on the project by the end of September.

Her daughter Shannon is married to a Navy pilot and they are stationed in Italy. They have two boys, William and Thomas. According to Gene, the family spends every weekend exploring Europe. Wow what a great opportunity for her grandchildren!

Unlike her husband who's been retired for 30 years, Gene is still a working professional. As a Leadership Assistant at Abraham Lincoln Elementary School, she's an administrator for the Extended Learning Program. An afterschool enrichment opportunity for kids which she describes as like running a summer camp. It's super fun because they have 2 pickleball courts and the kids are loving the game!! I wouldn't be surprised if she was out there helping them dink, smash or 3rd shot drop.

Tustin Unified School District (TUSD)

Our Tustin pickleball courts are owned by the Tustin Unified School District (TUSD). We have been privileged that the school district allowed us to continue to play pickleball on their school grounds for the past 13 years. We need to re-iterate some of the rules bestowed upon us as we have so many new members and some may be hearing this for the first time.

The court gates are unlocked by the school district's security team every morning and locked at night. The courts are available to the public daily and most holidays except when otherwise noted, such as special school events, or tournaments/round robins.

Our club obtains a use permit to reserve the courts for open play and special events. The permit also grants us access to the School District's restroom/water refill station.



To maintain our reputable relationship with the Tustin School District, please adhere to the following:

- 1. Abide by the School District court rules. These rules are posted on the fences outside the courts.
- 2. Do NOT park in the School District parking lot on the weekdays, Monday - Friday! Parking is only allowed on the street or the small lot on the east side of the courts. Cars will be towed. Membership may be revoked if parking ordinance is violated.
- 3. While in the School District building, remember we are guests. Keep the noise level down and the bathrooms clean.
- 4. No dogs allowed on school property unless approved by the School District.
- 5. No Smoking on the courts!
- 6. Please contact a Board member, NOT the School District if you have any concerns about the courts.

Tuesday Street Sweeping

Street sweeping no-parking hours on Service Road and School Lane is every Tuesday from 7:00am to 11:00am. The city was contacted regarding the impact to our drop-in play held every Tuesday during this time. Here is the city's response:

Street sweeping will begin on Service Road around 7:00am with a Tustin PD officer following to ticket any vehicles parked in the sweeper's path. Once the street has been swept, typically by 7:30am, players may park on the street. The city has assured us that the Tustin PD officer will not make a second pass on the street to write tickets once the street has been swept. Please note Carfax St by court 1 is also scheduled for street sweeping on Tuesdays. Street sweeping on Carfax St is later in the morning. We suggest that you do not park on Carfax St during their no-parking hours.

TUSD Maintenance Parking Lot and Restroom

There is NO PARKING ALLOWED in the TUSD Maintenance and Operations parking lot adjacent to the pickleball courts on Mondays thru Fridays, from 6:00am to 3:30pm. The Tustin school district will have your car towed.

TUSD maintenance requests that there is no drop off, U-turns, or drive throughs in the parking lot. Also, members should not drop off passengers along the right-side curve (marked as a red zone) going from Service Road to School Lane. This is a very dangerous blind spot for westbound vehicles. Also, there is no parking in the striped area in the parking lot behind the courts. Cars have been ticketed and may be towed.

The restrooms are available to Tustin Pickleball members from 7:00am to 10:00am only, on organized play days, Mondays – Saturdays. Members should not ask TUSD employees to open the restroom door outside of these hours.

We are fortunate to have a great partnership with the Tustin Unified School District. They have made several accommodations to work with Tustin Pickleball and not following their rules and guidelines can and will jeopardize our program's existence.



2024 Membership Renewal



Thank you for your support. Your membership fee helps pay for Tustin Pickleball's expenses such as permits, court usage fees, equipment, restroom access and insurance.

Membership is for the calendar year, January – December.

The benefits of membership include club discounts on pickleball merchandise at select websites, voting privileges, qualifying to be a Board Member, participation in club sponsored round robins and weekend ladder events.

Starting in January 2024, we will be raising our annual club membership fee to \$120 so that we can increase our club hours from 7-10am to 7-11am and provide funding for additional facility improvements and more special events. We will also increase our drop-in fee for non-members from \$5 to \$10 per day to help alleviate overcrowding and provide higher priority for our members.

To ease the transition and provide incentive for early renewals, we will be offering 2024 memberships for \$100 between October 1 and December 31, 2023.

We appreciate your continued support and look forward to another great year in 2024.
