1. The President called the meeting to order at 11:18 a.m.

4. The minutes for January were approved via email.
5. President's Report. This year continues strong. We have not seen a noticeable drop in participation due to other venues recently opening in the area (e.g., Mike Ward park in Irvine, Pickleball Haven in Lake Forest). Members continue to respond positively to the new 2026 player rotation rules which include single paddle racks, and win by one rule.
6. VP's Report. Tustin Unified School District (TUSD) opened up the schedule through the end of 2026, so Carl submitted permit requests for our regular Mon-Sat hours and planned special weekend events. The next one is the Team Challenge on May 2 and 3.
7. Treasurer's Report. Gerry got multiple bids for increased liability and property damage insurance. Greg will review and compare the policies and make a recommendation at the next meeting. Greg will also research commercial versions of Venmo and Zelle to simplify collection of drop-in fees.
8. Items for Discussion.

- a. As an organizational guideline, the club does not participate in the promotion or sale of merchandise offered by members/players at the courts during regular organized play.
- b. Terry and Jimmy met with TUSD to review facilities projects. TUSD will advise which projects they can undertake with their funds. Unfunded projects (if any) will be discussed at a future board meeting to approve expenditures. Proposed projects include:
  - i. Fixing damaged/leaning fences between Courts 3 & 4 and 7 & 8.
  - ii. Repairing benches on Courts 1 and 4.
  - iii. Adding a trash can on Court 4.
  - iv. Replacing worn fence toppers.
  - v. Adding an electric outlet in the shed.
- c. Tustin Pickleball has a clear Code of Conduct posted on our web site and at the check in desk. All members agree to abide by the code as a condition of membership. When a conflict arises between members and a Director has to intervene, the parties involved will be reminded of the Code and will be issued a warning that further disciplinary action could be taken if the conflict cannot be resolved on its own.

#### 9. Directors' Updates

- a. Communications. Greg created a Google Workspace for the Tustin Pickleball Organization, including email addresses for board members. The workspace will allow for a centralized storage of the Organization's files.
- b. Events. We have about 150 people signed up for drills. The recent Round Robin went well. Greg will look into having a Demo Day where brand representatives would bring demo paddles for members to test.
- c. Facilities. In addition to the projects in 8.b., Jimmy researched a variety of methods for drying courts after rain. He will get some new foam rollers.
- d. Membership is now at 822.
